Deerfield Centers for Drug & Alcohol Treatment (DCAT)

Deerfield Centers for Addiction Treatment (DCAT) is a licensed outpatient treatment program dedicated to helping people suffering from substance abuse problems. Patients are treated with respect, have their confidentiality maintained and are provided a safe place to begin their recovery. We use an abstinence-based model for long-term health and recovery.

Addiction clinicians complete an assessment that allows for a personalized and comprehensive treatment approach. They also work with patients to develop flexible treatment plans, integrating both professional care and self-help approaches. We understand individuals vary widely in terms of motivation for treatment and lifestyle changes. We meet regularly with each patient, monitor progress, coordinate care and assist with discharge planning and after care needs.

Assessments

An evaluation is scheduled to determine the appropriate level of care for each client. Assessments are provided for children and adults. We also offer nurse assessments and health care linkage.

Outpatient Services

Individuals will meet with one of our addictions counselors for one-on-one sessions, typically on a weekly basis. Outpatient sessions may be supplemented with one of our specialized groups as well.

Intensive Outpatient Services (IOP)

IOP is a structured group experience for individuals requiring a higher level of care. This program meets three (3) days per week, up to nine \pounds 1/2 hours, with evening sessions to accommodate work schedules.

Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT)

Services are offered to individuals who experience difficulty progressing in their recovery due to inconsistent adherence to their medication regime. Nurses and technicians work with individuals and their prescribers to support self-management of their medications.

Certified Recovery Services (CRS)

This service allows you to work with a certified peer specialist to further assist and support your personal recovery from drugs and alcohol. The CRS can also educate you about community resources, recovery and planning, community activities and life skills.
